The Fassetts of Licking County, Ohio and their Descendants

The Fassetts who came to Licking County, Ohio, in the early nineteenth century came from Vermont and are descended from Capt. John Fassett, Jr. (1743-1803) of Cambridge, Vermont. John Fassett's family was among the early emigrants to Vermont following the granting of land west of the Connecticut River in 1760 by the Governor of New Hampshire. John's father, Deacon John Fassett (1720-1794), brought his family north from Hardwick, Massachusetts, to Bennington, Vermont, in the summer of 1761. There he became a tavern keeper, founder of the new Church of Christ, and Captain of the first military company in Bennington. This migration came about when some twenty families living in Hardwick and Sunderland, Massachusetts, split off from their congregations as part of a growing movement against the religious intolerance in the established colonies.

In addition to the religious turbulence at the time, there was considerable political turbulence as well. Both New York and New Hampshire claimed Vermont, and, in 1769, Ethan Allen founded the Green Mountain Boys, a militia to protect the territory against New York. Soon, their activities turned to a fight against the British during the Revolution, and John Fassett, Jr. served as a Captain in Seth Warner's regiment. An interesting historical document which has survived is the diary which he kept during the march to Montreal in the fall of 1774. The diary was reproduced in a history and genealogy published by Harry Parker Ward, *The Follett-Dewey Fassett-Safford Ancestry...*, (Champlin, Columbus, Ohio, 1896). He married Hannah Safford (1746-1810) in Bennington in 1764 and lived just north of Bennington in Arlington (where he served as a representative in the Vermont legislature). Later, he moved further north to Cambridge near Mt. Mansfield, and served first as judge on the Vermont Superior Court and then as judge in the Chittenden County Circuit Court. His signature appeared on the currency issued by the Republic of Vermont during the interval between independence and statehood. His oldest daughter, Sarah, married Judge Noah Chittenden, son of Vermont's first governor, Thomas Chittenden. She was also sister-in-law of Governor Martin Chittenden, and her daughter, Hannah, married Truman Galusha, son of Governor Jonas Galusha.

However many of Capt. John Fassett Jr.'s children did not remain in Vermont and moved further west where the land was more conducive to farming than were the icy slopes of Mt. Mansfield. Of his nine children, two, Persis Fassett Follett and Joseph Fassett went to Licking County, Ohio, to farm in the early nineteenth century, while another son, Dr. John Fassett, moved to Toledo, Ohio, where he practiced medicine. A third son Brig. Gen. Elias Fassett, who was in command of the U.S. Infantry during the War of 1812, had two sons, Dr. Harry Fassett and Elias Fassett, Jr. who moved to Licking County shortly before 1820 as well. And John's youngest daughter, Susannah Fassett Green, joined the Ohio Fassetts and lived out her days in Granville following her husband's death.

This document traces those descendants of Capt. John Fassett, Jr. who moved to Licking County, Ohio, in the early nineteenth century. Few descendants now remain there as the trek westward continued during the mid-nineteenth century when the California gold fields promised even more wealth and adventure than did the fertile farmlands of Ohio a generation earlier. Dr. Harry Fassett made the entire trip in one generation. A grandson of Capt. John Fassett, Jr., Harry was born in Cambridge, Vermont, in 1794 and was trained in medicine at Middlebury. He rode horseback to Johnstown, Ohio, in 1819 where he married and took up medical practice. He retired from medicine to a farm in Granville, but then in 1872 in his old age he, his wife, Clarissa and his youngest son, Willie, took the newly opened rail line to San Francisco to join three of their children who had emigrated during the gold rush days of 1852.

There are inevitable omissions and factual errors in this genealogy, but I hope that some indication of the dispersal of the Fassetts is evident from these notes. Several published and unpublished genealogies have been invaluable in the gathering of the data. In particular, Katherine Fassett Schuster of Binghamton, New York, has traced the entire family virtually from its origin in Scotland to the mid-twentieth century [K.F. Schuster, *The Fassett Genealogy*, (Binghamton, N.Y., 1974)]. A unique source for history during the California migration is the collection of a hundred letters written during the ten-year period between 1852 and 1862 by the "Gold-Rush Fassetts" who left Johnstown, Ohio, for the California gold fields and who wrote back to their parents, Dr. Harry and Mrs. Clarissa Peck Fassett. These letters remained on the Alexandria farm of William Augustus Castle and his wife Sarah Fassett Castle and have been transcribed and edited by the late William A. Castle of Fredericksburg, Virginia. Also, Beatrice N. Savage of Paia, Hawaii, has been a valuable source of information on the descendants of the California

Fassetts, and Walter Castle of Columbus, Ohio, who grew up on the farm first farmed by his grandfather in Alexandria, Ohio, has been of immense help in preserving documentation from the earlier era.

The genealogy begins with the birth of Deacon John Fassett in Billerica, Massachusetts, in 1720, but it does not follow his children and grandchildren who remained in Vermont or moved to parts of Ohio outside of Licking County or to other parts the country.

Deacon John Fassett b. Apr 1 1720, Billerica, MA, (son of Josiah Fassett and Sarah Woolley of Billerica, MA), tavern keeper, Separatist, m. May 14 1741, Bedford, MA, Mary Woolley, b. 1720, (daughter of Thomas Woolley and Mary Chamberlain). She d. Sep 22 1782 at Bennington, VT. John died Aug 12 1794 at Bennington. After his marriage, John and Mary Woolley Fassett lived in Bedford, MA, near where he had been born, and where the first eight of their ten children were born. Bedford had been split off from Billerica in 1729. In 1753, John bought a farm in Hardwick, MA, where his parents had settled, but after about eight more years, the family left Hardwick, as part of the Separatist Movement. They were one of about 20 families who founded Bennington, VT, in the summer of 1761. John opened a tavern in Bennington and served as Captain in the first military company there. He was elected Clerk of the Church of Christ at Bennington at its first meeting on Dec 3 1762, and served as deacon; the church members had come to Bennington from Hardwick and Sunderland, MA, after disagreements with their ministers. John and several of his sons served in the militia during the Revolution, and after statehood, he was one of the Bennington representatives in the State Legislature. Mary (Woolley) Fassett was received into the Bennington church on Jan 11, 1765.

In 1791, the Republic of Vermont was admitted as the fourteenth state of the United States.

Johnstown where he stayed until retiring to a Granville farm in 1854. Several of his children, Ann Fassett Germain, Noah Chittenden Fassett, and Harris Harding Fassett, had emigrated to California between 1852 and 1854 as part of the Gold Rush, and in 1872, Harry and his wife, Clarissa, left Ohio by train (the cross-country rail link was finished in 1869) to spend the rest of their days in California with their children. Harry died at the home of his son N.C. Fassett in Oakland May 19, 1872, shortly after reaching California. NOTES: [1993-04-19, from notes by Edward Sears Castle] 'HARRY FASSETT rode on horseback from Cambridge, Vt. (a few miles north-west of Mt. Mansfield), to Johnstown, Ohio, in about 1880. He long practised medicine in Johnstown, and there married Clarissa Peck, daughter of a widow by that name who had immigrated from Nova Scotia. The sixth of the ten children of this couple was Sarah Fassett, who became the wife of her schoolteacher, William Augustus Castle; she was my paternal grandmother. She was a small, long-faced, somewhat sad-eyed, quiet woman with a tremendous head of hair. She often stayed with us in Belmont, and with my Uncle Edward and Aunt Mary at their chicken farm in E. Bridgewater, Mass.' Clarissa: The Pecks moved from Nova Scotia to Johnstown, OH, when Clarissa was 14 years old. She met her future husband Dr. Harry Fassett there.

With a partner, William Hale, he opened a successful general store in the gold mining town of Placerville. He returned to Ohio briefly in the summer of 1854 and brought his younger brother, Harris Harding Fassett, back with him to help with his business, and by 1857, he had moved to San Francisco leaving Harris in charge of the store. His San Francisco ventures were also successful, and he traveled frequently extending his business interests throughout the region and into Mexico. He was able to send his father substantial funds from his profits, and, after his marriage to Hattie Bottsford, lived in Oakland. Eventually, his parents and two additional brothers joined him in California traveling by train in 1872, and his mother, Clarissa P. Fassett, lived with him in his Oakland home until her death in 1890. Chitt died the following year aged 61, and is buried in Mountain View Cemetery in Oakland.
